## Lunchtime event for researchers

The Open Science Working Group gives researchers the opportunity to learn about the evolution of Research Data Management at ETH Zurich. ETH Zurich adopted its own guidelines for research data management ([RDM Guidelines](#)) in July 2022 after an ETH-wide consultation. The RDM Guidelines support researchers in their work with research data. The focus is on their optimal processing and accessibility for humans and machines according to the FAIR principles. FAIR stands for Findable, Accessible, Interoperable and Re-usable. The RDM Guidelines are aimed at researchers, but also guide ETH in adapting its support services and infrastructures for researchers and research groups accordingly

On behalf of the Vice President for Research, the Open Science Working Group offers an information event for researchers to provide an overview on the development of research data management at ETH and the support services and data infrastructures available to researchers since the RDM Guidelines have been put into force.
